

Who is Dr. Claudia Sheinbaum?

- President Elect of Mexico (2024-2030)
- Physicists from National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM)
- Master Degree Environment UNAM
- PhD Energy UNAM (research at Berkeley University, California)
- > Environmental background as former Secretary of Environment of Mexico City.
- ➤ Close political ties with current President Lopez Obrador
- ➤ Left-center political ideology
- > Introduced iconic projects in Mexico City (Metrobus, waste management)
- > Active member of MORENA political party
- Considered pragmatic and academic oriented
- > From Lituanian Azkenasi heritage (although laic Jew)
- > First Woman as President of Mexico in history





Economic Agenda

Budget Deficit Reduction: Sheinbaum's top priority is to shrink Mexico's budget deficit, which reached 5.8% of GDP in 2024. Addressing this issue is crucial for signaling the country's debt sustainability.

Boosting Economic Growth: Under the previous administration, Mexico's annual GDP growth averaged just 1.1%. Sheinbaum aims to stimulate growth by capitalizing on the trend of nearshoring — shifting supply chains to countries closer than China — and attracting foreign investment. To achieve this, the government must strengthen the rule of law and improve energy reliability.

Renewable Energy Investment: Sheinbaum has committed to expanding renewable-energy capacity. If she follows through, it could lead to a 3.5% increase in jobs and a 1.6% rise in GDP, according to estimates.

Infrastructure and Social Spending: Sheinbaum proposes building one million homes to generate two million jobs, investing in infrastructure, and creating industrial hubs linked with education and welfare development.

Education and Workforce Development: Sheinbaum recognizes the importance of an educated workforce. Her agenda includes investing in education, vocational training, and skill development to enhance employability and productivity.

Digital Transformation: Sheinbaum aims to accelerate Mexico's digital transformation. This involves improving internet connectivity, promoting e-commerce, and fostering innovation in technology and data-driven sectors.

Sustainable Development: Sheinbaum emphasizes sustainable practices, including environmental protection, clean energy adoption, and responsible resource management. These efforts align with global goals such as the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Public-Private Partnerships: Sheinbaum seeks to collaborate with the private sector to drive economic growth. By fostering partnerships, she aims to create jobs, improve infrastructure, and enhance public services.




